Some idioms and slang:

kerfuffle (pg 55, par 2): a disturbance or commotion typically caused by a dispute or conflict **spaz** (pg 56, par 4): one who is inept, a klutz (*often offensive*)

erupted in applause (pg 57, par 3): clapped suddenly and enthusiastically.

yellow-bellied chicken (pg 59, last par): one who lacks courage or acts out of fear.

pipe dream (pg 62, par 2): an extremely fantastic plan, hope, or story, not likely to come true **spilled to the press** (pg 63, par 4): Told a secret to a news reporter

the Grinch (pg 65, par 3): A mean character who became kind in Dr. Seuss's story, *How the Grinch Stole Christmas.* The day he became kind, the Grinch's heart "grew three sizes."

screwed things up royally (pg 66, par 3): Made a major mistake keeping issues at bay (pg 66, last par): controlling issues so they don't cause other problems.

for Pete's sake! (pg 67, par 1): added to a statement to express frustration or amazement.

This is a more polite version of "for Christ's sake!" and might refer to Saint Peter.

gave him tingles (pg 68, par 13): made him feel prickly in response to favorable emotions.

to live out of one's luggage (pg 71, par 10): to travel so often that you don't bother to unpack your suitcases.

- **fight-or-flight adrenaline mode** (pg 73, par 3): causing physiological changes in the body (such as an increase in heart rate) in response to stress
- M&Ms (pg 74, par 7): Button-shaped candy-coated chocolate.

Skittles (pg 74, par 7): Shaped like M&Ms by with very tart fruit flavors

tomfoolery (pg 74, last par): playful or foolish behavior

playing with people like pawns (pg 80, par 8): using other people to further one's own purposes. Taken from the game of chess where the pawn pieces are unimportant but are used to protect the more important pieces.

Manischewitz wine (pg 83, par 1): a sweet, Concord-grape wine, containing corn syrup, that is often used by non-Orthodox Jews in celebrating Passover.

minions (pg 85, last par): followers who are servile, willing to do whatever you ask.

It really spoke to me. (pg 86, par 6): I really liked it and found meaning in it.

to go out clubbing (pg 88, par 6): to visit nightclubs or bars, often going from one to another.
