Vocabulary to Practice

- Autumn: Noun The season between summer and winter, characterized by cooler temperatures and falling leaves. Example: "The trees change color in autumn, creating a beautiful landscape."
- Leaves: Noun The flat, green structures of a plant that are attached to its branches; they change color and fall in autumn. Example: "The children played in the pile of leaves in the park."
- Harvest: Noun The process of gathering ripe crops or fruits from the fields. Example: "Farmers work hard during the harvest season to collect their crops."
- Season: Noun One of the four periods of the year: spring, summer, autumn, and winter. Example: "Many people enjoy the cool weather of the autumn season."
- Sweater: Noun A knitted piece of clothing worn to keep warm, typically with long sleeves and no buttons. Example: "She wore a cozy sweater to stay warm in the autumn breeze."
- Cool: Adjective Moderately cold; not warm or hot. Example: "The weather becomes cool in autumn, and we need to wear jackets."
- Rainy: Adjective Characterized by rain or frequent rainfall. Example: "In some regions, autumn can be a rainy season."
- Windy: Adjective Having strong winds or a lot of air movement. Example: "Hold on to your hat; it's very windy outside!"
- Colorful: Adjective Full of bright and vivid colors. Example: "The trees in the autumn forest are so colorful."
- Pumpkin: Noun A large, round, orange fruit with a thick skin and many seeds, often associated with autumn and Halloween. Example: "We carved a scary face on the pumpkin for Halloween."
- Bonfire: Noun A large outdoor fire, often used for celebrations or to keep warm in autumn. Example: "We gathered around the bonfire to roast marshmallows."
- Chestnut: Noun An edible nut that grows inside a prickly shell; it is often roasted and enjoyed in autumn. Example: "We picked chestnuts and roasted them over the fire."
