- Music: Noun Sounds or organized sounds produced by instruments or voices in a way that is pleasant or exciting to listen to. Example: "I enjoy listening to different genres of music."
- Song: Noun A piece of music with words that are sung. Example: "Her favorite song is a beautiful ballad."
- Instrument: Noun An object or device used to produce music, such as a guitar, piano, or drums. Example: "He plays the violin very well."
- Sing: Verb To produce musical sounds with the voice, usually with words. Example: "She loves to sing in the school choir."
- Dance: Verb To move rhythmically to music, often following a specific pattern or steps. Example: "We like to dance at parties."
- Melody: Noun A series of musical notes that form a recognizable tune. Example: "The melody of the song is catchy."
- Rhythm: Noun A regular pattern of beats or accents in music that creates a sense of flow and timing. Example: "The music has a lively rhythm."
- Genre: Noun A specific category or style of music, such as pop, rock, classical, or jazz. Example: "She enjoys exploring different music genres."
- Concert: Noun A public performance of music, often by a group of musicians or a band. Example: "They attended a classical music concert at the theater."
- Perform: Verb To present or execute a musical piece or show in front of an audience. Example: "The band will perform their new song at the concert."
- Lyrics: Noun The words of a song. Example: "She loves singing along to the lyrics of her favorite songs."
- Album: Noun A collection of songs or music tracks released by a musician or band. Example: "Their new album is topping the charts."
