Conversation Questions in Groups of 2 People:

- 1. Special Someone: Describe your mother or people who were like mothers in your life. What were they like?
- 2. Mama's Magic: What's one special quality or talent your mother (or mother figure) has that you like?
- 3. Memories Made: Share a favorite memory you have with your mother or a motherly figure.
- 4. Words of Wisdom: Did your mother or a mother figure ever give you advice that you still remember today? What was it?
- 5. More Than Biology: Do you think a mother is someone who gives birth to you, or can it be someone who raises and cares for you? Explain your thoughts.
- 6. Global Traditions: How does your culture celebrate mothers or motherhood? Share any special traditions or customs.
- 7. Mother's Day in America: Mother's Day is a U.S. holiday in May to honor mothers. Have you experienced this holiday? How is it celebrated?
- 8. Strong & Supportive: Has your mother or a mother figure been a source of strength and support for you in your life? Share a story.
- 9. Lessons Learned: Have you learned important life skills or values from your mother or a mother figure? For example, cooking, kindness, or hard work.
- 10. Beyond Mom: Have you had any other female role models in your life who acted as motherly figures? (e.g., teacher, aunt, grandmother)
- 11. Generational Differences: Do you think your relationship with your mother or mother figure is different from the relationship your mother had with hers? Why or why not?
- 12. Learning from Each Other: Do you find that you can teach your mother or mother figure new things as you get older? Share an example.

Vocabulary to Practice

- mother: (noun) A woman who gives birth to a child (also called a "mom").
- mother figure: (noun phrase) A woman who plays a similar role as a mother in someone's life, even if they are not biologically related. This could be an aunt, grandmother, teacher, or any other caring woman.
- Mother's Day: (noun phrase) A holiday celebrated in many countries to honor mothers and motherhood. In the United States, it is typically celebrated in May.
- appreciation: (noun) A feeling of gratitude or thankfulness for something or someone.
