10. Have you seen any American food shows or movies that made you curious about American cuisine? What dish would you like to try?
11. Are there any American actors or actresses you like? Who are they and why do you like them?
12. Have you discovered any American musicians or bands through watching TV shows or movies? What kind of music do you enjoy?
13. Have you seen any American TV shows or movies that you would recommend to others?
